

FIRST YEAR COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BIB100 Bible Study Methods - 1 Unit

This course provides an overview of methods, key tools and specific resources used in Biblical study. Students will be equipped for personal spiritual growth and ministry as they become more acquainted with knowing God through His Word, understanding the language of the Bible and discovering how to rightly divide the whole Word of God. Parables, figurative language, historical context, and prophecy are some of the topics included in this course designed to promote proper exegesis of the Bible.

BIB101 Old Testament Survey - 3 Units

This course is designed as a historical survey of the Old Testament with special attention given to the people and land which are the foundation of our faith. Exploration of God's Creation, the fall of man, and the line of redemption from the patriarchs to the Word that became Flesh, will provide a pathway for the connection between the Old and New Testaments. This overview will assist students in deepening their concept of Old Testament stories, examples, lineage, and their necessary application for successful living today.

BIB102 New Testament Survey - 3 Units

Knowing the context scripture was written in can make the difference between truth and error. This course is a study of New Testament events from an historic, economic, and religious background, identifying the rise of Christianity. Emphasis will be given to the context and authorship of the books, their themes, and their relevance to the modern church. Journey through the fulfillment of the promised Messiah, the beginnings of the Great Commission, the development and discipleship of the early Church, and the foretelling of the soon coming King.

BIB106 Prayer I - 1 Unit

Brother Kenneth E. Hagin said that some things about prayer are taught, and some things are better caught. This class provides instruction for things taught and demonstrations in prayer of what must be caught. Both will be presented as they pertain to the governing principles of all kinds of prayer. Prayer that is alive contains elements of fellowship, as well as the privilege of doing Kingdom Business with God. There is nothing that cannot be prevented, changed, or overcome through the effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man.



BIB107 Christ the Healer - 1 Unit

This course is designed to establish from the scriptures, it's the will of God to heal all today. Scriptural support for the principles of healing and an understanding of the importance of God's Word as the foundation for healing will be examined. Proof will be established that God is not only able to heal, but as a result of His compassion and mercy has made provision for healing through the finished work of Jesus.

BIB108 The Life of Christ - 3 Units

This course examines the person and ministry of Jesus revealed through a study of the Gospels and beyond. Focus will be on His message, miracles, being about His Father's business, and triumphantly fulfilling His mission. His nature as revealed in Old Testament types and New Testament examples will inspire a very real relationship with the Eternal King.

BIB111 The Blessing - 4 Units

God's first words to man were words of blessing. This course reveals God's original intent and connection to His man, not as a spiritual concept but a material reality. THE BLESSING and the historical and spiritual journey surrounding it, are examined in scripture. Students will recognize a sharp contrast between the world's system and God's system of operation as spiritual laws governing prosperity are revealed. Discovery of the true nature of God, which is His desire to demonstrate His love and goodness, will create a secure foundation from which students can receive all that encompasses God's prosperous plan for His children.

BIB112 Holy Spirit - 3 Units

This course provides a Biblical understanding of the Person and operation of the Holy Spirit. Students will learn principles to help them recognize and respond to the voice of the Lord in prayer and beyond. In this course, students will also learn how to walk in the power of God and receive revelation knowledge from the Holy Spirit for victorious living and service.

BIB113 Foundations of Faith - 4 Units

In this course students will become familiar with the God kind of faith, which is the same faith God placed in every believer. Foundational scripture truths explored will include the integrity of God's Word, the authority of Jesus' name, identification with Jesus' redemptive substitution, understanding the believer's position of right standing in Christ and development of a strong spirit. Students will learn about spiritual and physical laws governing the measure of faith granted to all believers and how to purposely exercise that faith for victorious living.



FIN101 Budget and Finance - 1 Unit

The Bible has a lot to say about the benefits, issues and pitfalls of managing personal finances. Students can expect to learn about budgeting, taxes, saving and investing as stewardship based on God's plan for their finances.

HIS101 The Jews, The Nations, and The Church - 1 Unit

This course examines three "people groups" described in scripture, defining their connections with one another through history, culture, and worldview. Special attention will be given to the covenants and the Hebrew roots of Christianity from type and shadow of fulfillment and restoration of the land. Emphasis will also be placed on the book of Revelation and understanding how to determine which of these three groups of people are written to, or about, in any given passage. This will help students discover their role in the great and triumphant end-time future God has planned.

MIN101 Ministry Survey & Practicum I & MIN102 Ministry Survey & Practicum II - 0 Units

This course sequence supports the direct ministry experiences gained in practicum placements each semester. By providing a classroom setting for reflective activities, students will be able to process what they are drawing from those experiences. This course also provides an overview of five-fold Ministry and Helps Ministry utilizing staff from various ministry areas, and a variety of speakers to further enhance students' knowledge and understanding of ministry, helping them to discover their unique ministry callings. Students are required to serve 30 hours per semester in various areas of Kenneth Copeland Ministries / Eagle Mountain International Church.

MIN103 Ethics: Honor, Integrity, and Excellence - 2 Units

God has established divine order in all He does. This course explores the supernatural power of God revealed in moral discernment and Christian ethics. Honor carries and is supported by the supernatural power of God; however, today's society is largely dishonorable because the concept of honor is not being passed on generationally. This powerful and scriptural look at the Biblical definition of honor will challenge students to live an honorable life, serving God on purpose with integrity and excellence, thereby qualifying themselves for the work of the ministry.

MIN104 Ministry Seminar I (Special Topics) – 1 Unit

Essential Biblical foundations topics will be highlighted in this course. Emphasis will be placed on applying what is being learned in this and other courses to ministry and life. This course is interactive and will include a variety of learning activities providing a foundational thread for various topics covered.



MIN105 Ministry Seminar II (Special Topics) – 1 Unit

Essential topics in ministry will be highlighted by staff and guest instructors. Emphasis will be placed on applying what is being learned in the other courses to ministry and life. This course is interactive and will include a variety of learning activities providing a foundational thread for seminar topics covered.

MIS101 Personal Evangelism - 1 Unit

Personal evangelism is the responsibility of every Christian. This course teaches students how to share Jesus without fear. Students will learn various strategies of personal evangelism and how to respond to the most common objections encountered in evangelistic ministry. Students will also recognize the importance of connecting new converts to a discipleship support system, thus equipping them for spiritual growth and development as a new creation in Christ.

SECOND YEAR COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CORE COURSES:

BIB201 Authority of the Believer - 2 Units

The God-ordained, creative authority given to every believer is examined in scripture. Special attention will be paid to Jesus' work in re-establishing mankind through the power of His blood and His name, destroying the power of the curse and returning the power of creativity and authority to mankind. This course will share the truths of God's Word concerning the power now made available to each believer for living every moment established in authority and free from the curse.

BIB202 The Fruits and Gifts of the Spirit - 2 Units

This course defines the nine gifts of the Holy Spirit as listed in Scripture. Examples of each gift as to its purpose, benefit, and governance of operation in believers will be given. Students will also explore the progression of the fruit of the Spirit in their lives since they became believers, how each fruit of the spirit works together, and the importance of developing and cultivating these gifts.



BIB203 Old Testament Truths - 3 Units

This course is a survey of the books of the Old Testament with special emphasis on their inspiration, history, and fulfillment in the New Testament. A historical record of adventures in God, the Old Testament, is filled with examples and insights for abundant living today. From inspirational poetry full of God's Wisdom to accounts of prophets, kings, and deliverers, the lives and times of Old Testament heroes of faith reveal God's ever-present covenant of love.

BIB204 Prayer II - 1 Unit

Brother Kenneth Copeland says, "For God to get involved in man's affairs legally, believers must pray correctly." Prayer must be faith-filled, Word-based, and Spirit-led. In addition, effective prayer is a partnership with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit through allowing Him to lead us into the truth of what needs to be prayed and how it needs to be prayed. This course provides a deeper study of what Spirit-led prayer is to look like in the life of a believer. Special instruction will be given to provide a detailed look at different kinds of prayer found throughout the Bible and the scriptural laws that govern them. In addition, students will be taught how to recognize the promptings of the Holy Spirit regarding what kind of prayer is needed in diverse situations. Due to the powerful tools God has given us, there can be confidence when we pray knowing that God has equipped us to pray victoriously!

BIB207 New Testament Truths - 3 Units

New Testament Truths course captures the essence and heart of the Gospel. This course examines the doctrine of the church age, or age of grace, as recorded in the Epistles. Students will learn the historical context and themes found in the Books of the New Testament. Examination of scripture, verse by verse, will uncover and further expound upon Biblical truths applicable for the Body of Christ throughout time.

BIB208 Principles of Biblical Interpretation - 3 Units

An overview of methods and principles of Biblical interpretation, including historical, cultural, contextual, figurative, and grammatical influences. This course is designed to teach practical applications to help students discover Biblical truths, recognize Jesus throughout the Bible, and to develop greater clarity when studying the Word.



BIB209 Laws of Prosperity - 1 Unit

There are instructions set forth in the Word of God to teach men how to live a prosperous life. This course examines spiritual laws governing prosperity revealed in God's Word. A heart unshakeable in God's established covenant produces results. Principles revealed through Jesus' own words will be examined as students grow in knowledge that God and His Word are the true Source of their supply and understanding the Law of the Seed connects them to all of heaven's benefits.

HIS202 Church History - 3 Units

This course is an examination of the Christian Church's history from first century AD to modern times, covering key milestones in a general overview from then to now. Study will include the development of Christian thought, institutions, expansion and the impact of Christianity on world culture. Emphasis will be given to Christian and World leaders and substantial events that impacted communities and nations, helping to shape the growth of Christianity. The power of God moving in His Church throughout the centuries will be unveiled as students are inspired to take courage and prepare this generation for the soon return of the Head of the Church.

MIN201 / MIN 202 Ministry Survey & Practicum III & IV - 0 Units

This course sequence supports the direct ministry experiences gained in practicum placements each semester. By providing a classroom setting for reflective activities, students will be able to process what they are drawing from those experiences. This course also provides an overview of five-fold Ministry and Helps Ministry utilizing staff from various ministry areas, and a variety of speakers to further enhance students' knowledge and understanding of their own ministry calling as they develop plans to fulfill their unique ministry callings. Students are required to serve 60 hours per semester in various areas of Kenneth Copeland Ministries / Eagle Mountain International Church.

MIN203 Ministry Seminar III (Special Topics) - 1 Unit

Essential topics in ministry will be highlighted by the instructor, staff, and guest instructors. Emphasis will be placed on applying what is being learned in this course, other courses, and practicum experiences to develop leadership for life and ministry. Introduction to purpose, mission, and core values will be integrated into this course as keys to successful leadership in life and ministry. This course is interactive, building on foundational biblical, leadership, and ministry principles to promote single-minded, faith-filled living and ministry of integrity and excellence.



MIN204 Ministry Seminar IV (Special Topics) - 1 Unit

This course is a continuation of **MIN 203**, where essential topics in ministry will be highlighted by the instructor, staff, and guest instructors. Emphasis will be placed on applying what is being learned in this course, other courses, and practicum experiences to develop leadership for life and ministry. This course is interactive, building on foundational biblical, leadership, and ministry principles to promote single-minded, faith-filled living and ministry of integrity and excellence.

MIN205 Family and Ministry - 1 Unit

Spiritual and practical aspects of family and ministry will be discussed and explored. The emphasis of this course is to focus on Biblical principles governing successful ministry in the context of family and secular social norms. The course study material, lectures, and assignments will shed biblical light on topics which include family, marriage, parenting, alternate lifestyles, financial stewardship, health, and fitness.

MIN206 People Skills- 1 Unit

A study of what it means to be a people-person. Special emphasis will be given to identifying and increasing personal character, improving people skills and dealing with difficult people. Effective management skills coupled with authenticity and self-control will be explored. This course will examine how the Word of God and Biblical precepts are the true foundation for successful interaction with others in ministry or as ministers.

PST201 Preaching and Teaching - 2 Units

This course analyzes the heart and structure of both preaching and teaching. Not only is it a study of the science and art of preparing sermons from a Spirt-led and faith-filled perspective, but also an exploration of how to strategically plan instruction to further student understanding. Students will learn various styles of sermon preparation and delivery including topical, textual and expository. They will also discover insights for how to make learning meaningful as they inspire and instruct.



SECOND YEAR ELECTIVES:

AVT201 Aviation in Ministry - 1 Unit

This course provides an overview of aviation in ministry and missions. Students will gain insight into both the spiritual and natural responsibilities of aviation in ministry, including financial, logistical, training and maintenance, along with its many benefits.

BIB200 Prayer Dynamics: Prevailing in Prayer - 1 Unit

Are you hungry to go deeper in your prayer life? Would you like to learn how to obtain answers to prayers that have gone unanswered? Would you like to learn some key elements to prevailing in prayer? God wants the answers to your prayers to be frequent and fruitful. One meaning for the word "prevail" is "prove more powerful than opposing forces; be victorious." (New Oxford American Dictionary) This course will provide you with keys that will unlock heaven's resources and release the dynamic power of God that brings answers to prayer and victory over the opposing forces every time!

BUS201 Business and Marketplace Leadership - 1 Unit

This course is designed to equip and empower students for marketplace leadership, entrepreneurship and service with integrity and excellence. Students will discover key strategies for how to be successful in the marketplace, learning Kingdom culture for global impact.

COM201 Writing Content in Ministry - 1 Unit

This course is designed to help students locate the theme overflowing in their heart and to equip them as ready writers (Psalms 45:1 NKJV), enabled to effectively articulate their available voice. Students will learn rhetorical situations, elements of style and composition principles that promote writing well. They will have opportunity to learn about various mediums of writing content utilized at Kenneth Copeland Ministries and Eagle Mountain International Church.

HIS201 Revival History: What Every Christian Should Know - 1 Unit

This course provides an overview of untold Church History everyone should know. These core precepts impacted core Bible events including Christ's death. These teachings impacted what people believe of the Bible, the Blessing, experiencing miracles, walking in faith and the supernatural. In this lecture course, trace the timeline, events, key people who impacted the Early Church through 20th century events. Students will examine the connection between their love walk and what is still being taught today to power that additional release of the Move of God in their lives.



MED201 Media and Technology in Ministry I - 1 Unit

A course designed to introduce students to the various aspects of Christian media now available to churches and ministries. This course will give detailed attention to television and internet and will also provide experiential opportunities and training on equipment. Students will gain insight into the creative, organizational, and logistical requirements associated with excellence in media ministry.

MED202 Media and Technology in Ministry II - 1 Unit

This course will be a continuation of MED201 further exploring the building blocks of Ministry and Message. Students will gain perceptiveness into the methods and means to blend technical skills and creativity, while creating and developing content, through observation and hands-on activities.

MIN200 Ministry of Helps - 1 Unit

This course provides a Biblical foundation for Ministry of Helps and its vital role in the Body of Christ and the local church. Emphasis is placed on understanding Ministry of Helps not as volunteerism, but members developing and releasing their unique gifts and talents by doing the work of the ministry.

MIN207 Church/Ministry Administration - 1 Unit

A study in functional aspects of managing a church or ministry including organization, staffing, training, and strategic planning based upon its vision. Students will learn God's perspective on promotion and how it relates to identifying and choosing key leadership and staff. Students will learn the importance of taking time off as a necessity for maintaining ministerial effectiveness.

MIS201 Missions and Outreach - 1 Unit

This course provides a Biblical foundation for outreach and missions based on the Great Commission and the command to make disciples of all men. Students will gain a fundamental understanding of the difference between short-term missions and outreach projects versus career missions and effective strategies for missionary work being used around the world today. Students will have opportunity to participate in the missions and outreach programs at Kenneth Copeland Ministries and Eagle Mountain International Church.



PST202 Pastoral Ministry - 1 Unit

This course places focus on the heart of a pastor and establishes the correct motivation, roles, and functions of pastoral ministry as specified in Scripture. Exploration of effective, yet applicable strategies for ministering to others within pastoral care will be covered. Aspects of pastoring in and out of the pulpit will be discussed revealing that pastoring has much to do with one-to-one interaction in building up the congregation. Students will gain practical insights and techniques for ministering at traditional events and services such as baptisms, weddings, and funerals. Emphasis will be place on how a pastor's personal life with the Father and job specific pressures can affect their congregation directly; therefore, diligence to attend to their own physical, mental, and spiritual health will be presented.

PST203 Biblical Counseling I - 1 Unit

This course is designed to help Christian leaders learn how to integrate Biblical principles into counseling to meet the basic needs of people – spirit, soul and body. A survey of causes, effects, and counseling considerations will be studied using case studies of personal, interpersonal, and developmental issues to promote lasting change.

PST204 Crisis Response and the Church - 1 Unit

A crisis is a time of loss, change, or stress that takes people out of their comfort zones and normal coping patterns. This course provides a general overview of crisis intervention models and how to effectively mobilize a ministry to support the efforts of First Responders and other national, state and local crisis response efforts. This course will also provide specific ways the Church can be a resource to its members or partners affected by a crisis.

STM201 Children and Youth Ministry - 1 Unit

This course provides an overview of the developmental characteristics of children and youth from birth through high school and their specific needs as it pertains to ministry. Students will learn practical strategies and methods for program planning and current trends of discipleship that will help build faith in the next generation.

STM202 Young Adults Ministry - 1 Unit

This course is a study of the unique needs of youth as they transition into college, careers and marriage. Students will learn relevant ministry and programming axioms for young adults that support integration and leadership into the life of local church.



WOR201 Worship Ministry I - 1 Unit

This course will introduce students to a Biblical understanding of worship and the historical role of worship ministry in the Church. Students will learn to develop a God-centered focus in personal and corporate worship, and an appreciation of different styles and genres of church worship.

WOR202 Worship Ministry II - 1 Unit

This course continues to build on the Biblical understanding of worship ministry in the Church introduced in WOR201, providing a technical overview of the mechanics and inner workings of a worship service and a creative arts department. Students will learn the basics of how to implement the heart of worship and put it in service production.
